PAYMENTS FRAUD: CURRENT SCHEMES AND MITIGATION STRATEGIES

This presentation will discuss the growing trend in payments fraud, including common schemes related to checks, authorized push payments and cryptocurrency. Additionally, the presentation will discuss potential mitigation strategies, red flag indicators and action steps.

COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT ACT (CRA) OVERVIEW

This presentation will provide a brief history on the Community Reinvestment Act and elaborate on the evaluation process, ratings, and how various components are assessed during the examination process.

EMERGING TECHNOLOGY
